

BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT

Rationale:

Student misbehaviour is detrimental to teaching and learning objectives and may compromise the safety of students and staff.

Purpose:

The purpose of this policy is to provide the school with a range of options for dealing with misbehaviour and to ensure misbehaviour is managed in a consistent and transparent way.

Scope:

This policy applies to all students and staff.

Guidelines:

- 1. The school will provide a range of solutions to deal with misbehaviour. The chosen option will depend upon:
 - a. The seriousness of the misbehaviour
 - b. The individual circumstances of the student
- 2. Behaviour management processes will be fair and flexible.
- 3. The school will provide appropriate support and guidance to students involved in misbehaviour.
- 4. The Board of Trustees will appoint a Disciplinary Committee with specific powers to act according to the Education and Training Act 2020 and the Education (Stand-down, Suspension, Exclusion and Expulsion) Rules 1999.
- 5. The Board and Principal will adhere to the provisions of the legislation.
