COLOURS AWARD PROGRAMME



Rationale:

In accordance with its Strategic Plan, the school fosters a positive school-wide belief that all students can succeed. The Colours Award Programme is intended to encourage success and reinforce individual self-esteem of students.

Purpose:

The purpose of this policy is to provide guidelines for the provision of a Colours Award Programme at Whangarei Boys' High School.

Definitions:

Colours means visible decoration, in the form of badges, fixed to the school uniform or dress blazer, signifying honours.

Scope:

This policy applies to all staff and students.

Guidelines:

- The school will operate a Colours Award programme to encourage success and reinforce individual self-esteem of students
- 2. The programme recognises and honours the attainment of (a) excellence, (b) sustained service, or (c) sustained participation at an advanced level, by providing tangible acknowledgement.
- 3. The programme applies across the range of curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities available to students at WBHS, encompassing academic, sporting and cultural pursuits.
- 4. The programme may also include outstanding achievement of students in activities not currently available or supported at WBHS.
- 5. Tangible acknowledgement consists of colour badges that can be affixed on the school uniform or dress blazer and may be supplemented with other forms of tangible award.
- The Principal is responsible for operating the Colours Award programme, including:
 - a. Establishing and maintaining consistent and fair criteria for awarding of colours.
 - b. Selection and award process.
 - c. Design and detail of colours
 - d. Making information readily available to students and caregivers about the programme criteria, range of awards, eligibility and selection process.
