



University, Waikato University, Victoria University, Canterbury University, and Otago University.

OUR SCHOOL CURRICULUM

Points to Note YEAR 9

Students study English, Science, Social Studies, Mathematics, Physical Education, Health, and Materials Technology for the full year.
Te Reo Māori and a choice of either Art, Drama or

Music, are studied for half a year. Students also select two option subjects* which are studied for half a year.

YEAR 10

Students study six compulsory subjects and three option subjects*. Please select a spare subject.

YEAR 11

Mathematics & English are compulsory. Students study six subjects all year. Please select a spare subject.

YEAR 12

Students select six subjects and a spare subject. It is important to identify subjects that lead to the trades and those that prepare students for University Entrance. It is possible to repeat Level 1.

YEAR 13

Students select five subjects and a spare. They may also select from Years 11 and 12 subjects.

SUPPORTED LEARNING

Extra learning support in a safe environment for those who do not cope with the structure of secondary school.

Our school also has a dedicated golf academy, providing students with the most comprehensive golf coaching and development programme in Northland.

We have produced countless sporting champions, winning at regional, national and global competitions across a wide range of sporting codes, including golf, rugby, swimming, cricket, athletics, hockey, football, basketball, sailing, adventure racing, surfing, squash, badminton, tennis, table tennis, clay target shooting, rugby league, AFL, touch rugby and weight lifting.













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ACCOMMODATION

A safe, friendly and supportive living environment is arranged for all international students, either with a homestay family or boarding at Carruth House.

Carruth House boarding hostel provides safe and secure boarding within the school grounds, with friendly, caring staff and a safe and welcoming atmosphere. Carruth House is within walking distance to doctors, chemists, shopping and sporting facilities.

Homestay accommodation is arranged by our Homestay Coordinator, and every effort is made to match the students with a family who have shared interests.

All homestay and boarding students are well supported, with routines and guidelines to enhance opportunities for educational and social learning and development.
